The Organ Committee has finished working on the preliminary proposal for the renovation of our organ with representatives of the Schantz Organ Company. The proposal was presented to the Worship Committee and received their endorsement to take the proposal to the Church Council.

A presentation will be made by members of the Organ Committee to the Church Council at their retreat on August 13th. The Organ Committee will need to receive permission from the Church Council to move forward with the proposal. After the Church Council's permission is received, the proposal will be brought to the Congregational Assembly for its approval. Then the funding phase of the project would begin. The Organ Committee has discussed various possibilities for funding the project, but no definitive decisions have been made pending final approval of the proposal.

The Organ Fund is primarily used to maintain the organ. It recently paid for the structural examination of the rear balcony to see if the balcony could support a new console and gallery organ. Your support is greatly appreciated. If you would like to donate to the Organ Fund, write "Organ Fund" and the amount on the "Other" line of your church envelope or write "Organ Fund" on the "memo" line of your check made out to *Trinity Lutheran Church* and place the check in the offering basket.

Trinity's first and second pastors were the Walther brothers – Otto Herman Walther and C.F.W. Walther. Otto Herman served as our pastor only about a year before dying of typhoid fever. He was succeeded by his brother, Carl Ferdinand Wilhelm, who served as the official pastor of the congregation from 1841 until his death in 1887.

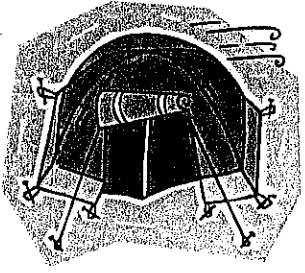
While serving as our pastor, Walther began work on a hymnal for use in this country. Up to this time, one of the school teachers would read the words of a hymn verse aloud to the congregation who would then sing it.

On November 10, 1845, Trinity voted to underwrite the publication of this hymnal by Ludwig Publishing Co. in New York, using it for the first time here at Trinity in August of 1847. In 1863, this hymnal, already introduced to all congregations of the Missouri Synod, was given by Trinity congregation as a gift to the Synod together with all revenue derived from its publication and sales.

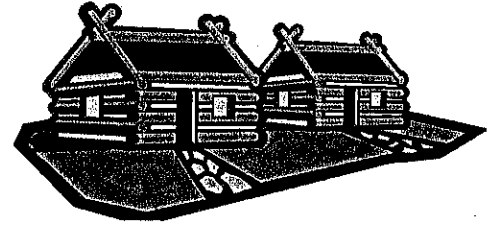
