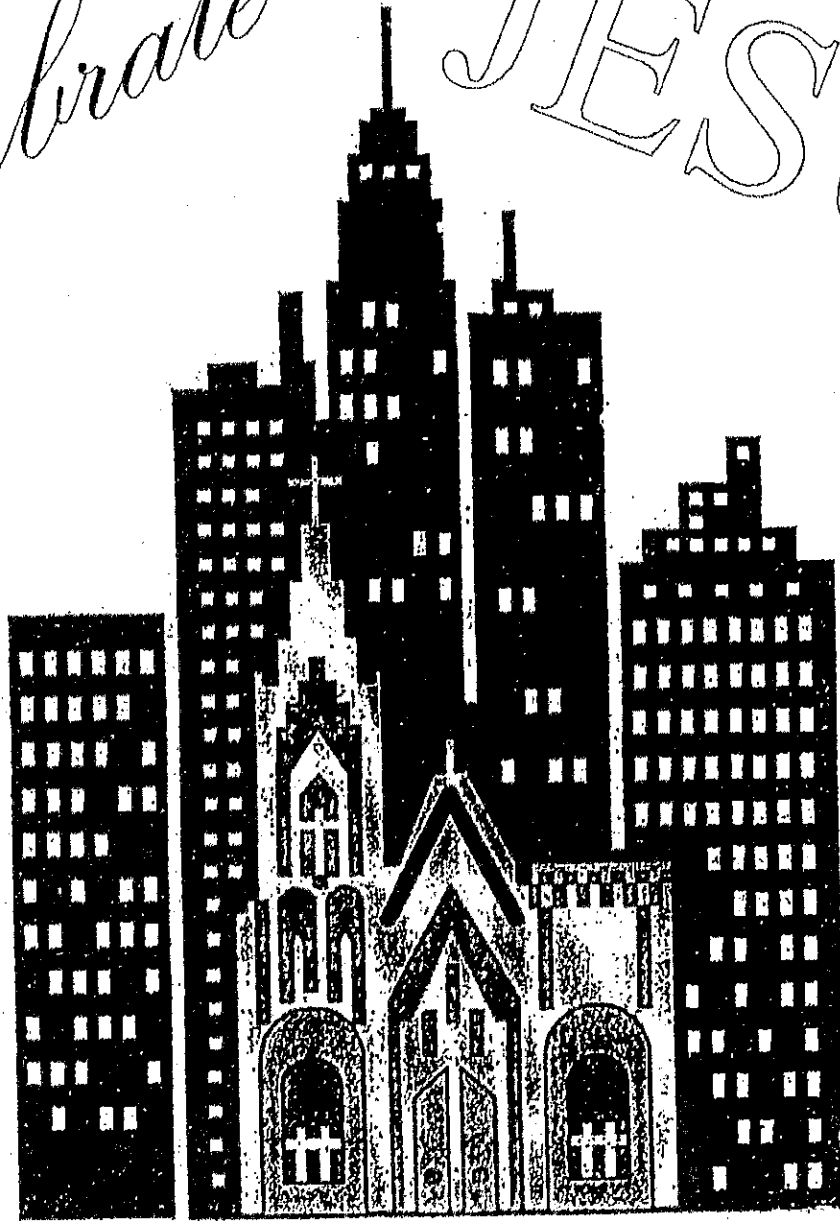

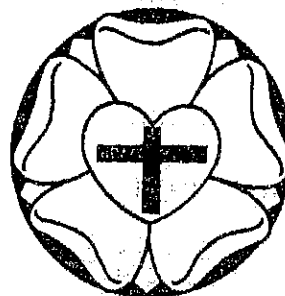



Welcome



Confession and Absolution

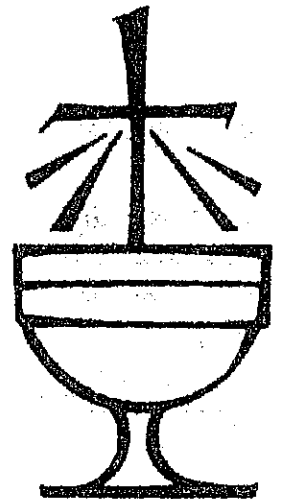
Leader: Let us confess our sins to the Lord, imploring Him for the sake of His Son Jesus Christ to grant us forgiveness.

Order of Holy Baptism

Pastor: (to the ones being baptized)

Our Lord commanded Baptism, saying to his disciples in the last chapter of Matthew: "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I will be with you always, to the very end of the age." The holy apostles of the Lord have written: "The promise is for you and your children," and: "Baptism now saves you."

We also learn from the Word of God that we all are conceived and born sinful and so are in need of forgiveness. We would be lost forever unless delivered from sin, death, and everlasting condemnation. But the Father of all mercy and grace has sent his Son Jesus Christ, who atoned for the sin of the whole world that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.

Receive the sign of the holy cross both upon your foreheads and upon your hearts to mark you as one redeemed by Christ the crucified.

Pastor: (to the parents and sponsors)

It is your task as parents and sponsors to confess with the whole Church the faith in our God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, in whose name Stella Rae Lorton and Leah Grace Teepe are to be baptized. After they have been baptized you are at all times to remember them in your prayers, put them

in mind of their Baptism, and, as much as in you lies, give your counsel and aid, that they share in the true knowledge and worship of God. As they grow in years, you are to place into their hands the Holy Scriptures, bring them to the services of God's house, and provide for their further instruction in the Christian faith. Our prayer is that, abiding in their baptismal grace and in communion with the Church, they may grow up to lead godly lives to the praise and honor of Jesus Christ. If you intend to do this act of love gladly and willingly, then answer, "Yes, with the help of God."

Parents and Sponsors: Yes, with the help of God.

Pastor: (to the congregation)

Let us all, together with sponsors and parents, faithfully speak in testimony of the forgiveness of sin and the birth of the life of faith which God our Father bestows in and through Baptism.

Pastor: Do you renounce the devil and all his works and all his ways?

People: **I do renounce them.**

Pastor: Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty?

People: **Yes, I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.**

Pastor: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son?

People: **Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From thence he will come to judge the living and the dead.**

Pastor: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

People: **Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

Trinity's first and second pastors were the Walther brothers – Otto Herman Walther and C.F.W. Walther. Otto Herman served as our pastor only about a year before dying of typhoid fever. He was succeeded by his brother, Carl Ferdinand Wilhelm, who served as the official pastor of the congregation from 1841 until his death in 1887.

While serving as our pastor, Walther began work on a hymnal for use in this country. Up to this time, one of the school teachers would read the words of a hymn verse aloud to the congregation who would then sing it.

On November 10, 1845, Trinity voted to underwrite the publication of this hymnal by Ludwig Publishing Co. in New York, using it for the first time here at Trinity in August of 1847. In 1863, this hymnal, already introduced to all congregations of the Missouri Synod, was given by Trinity congregation as a gift to the Synod together with all revenue derived from its publication and sales.

This being the Bicentennial year of Walther's birth, there are many special projects, events, tours and services being planned in commemoration. Trinity will be hosting a special service on Sunday afternoon, October 23, 2011. Before that event there will be more bulletin inserts providing further details about the life and deeds of our beloved Pastor Walther.
