Second Lesson

Romans 3:19-28

¹⁹Now we know that whatever the law says, it says to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced and the whole world held accountable to God.

²⁰ Therefore no one will be declared righteous in his sight by observing the law; rather, through the law we become conscious of sin. ²¹ But now a righteousness from God, apart from law, has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testify.

²² This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference, ²³ for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴ and are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus.

²⁵ God presented him as a sacrifice of atonement, through faith in his blood. He did this to demonstrate his justice, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished— ²⁶ he did it to demonstrate his justice at the present time, so as to be just and the one who justifies those who have faith in Jesus.

²⁷ Where, then, is boasting? It is excluded. On what principle? On that of observing the law? No, but on that of faith. ²⁸ For we maintain that a man is justified by faith apart from observing the law.



I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.



Confession and Absolution

Pastor: Because it is our intention to receive the Holy Supper of our Lord Jesus Christ, it is proper that we examine ourselves, confess our sins, and ask His forgiveness.

People: If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. But if we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins, cleanse us from all unrighteousness, and set us free to serve in His name.

(The confession reflects the three "Solas"---"alones"---of the Reformation: Grace alone, Scripture alone, Faith alone.)

Leader: Let us then confess our sins to God our Father.

People: We confess, merciful God that we have let ourselves be enslaved to our selfish egos. We have expected to find Your favor because of our good works instead of relying on Your grace alone. Forgive us and reform us to know again the freedom You offer through Your perfect pardon.

Leader: Our Savior's sacrifice was once and for all. God's grace covers all your sins.

People: We confess, O Holy Spirit, that we have sought other assurances than those You have revealed through the sacred Scriptures. Our faith has waxed and waned according to our health, wealth, and earthly success; we have become captive to them instead of relying on Scripture alone. Forgive us and reform us to know again the freedom that rests on the gracious revelation of Your eternal plans for us.

Leader: God's inspired Word speaks about our Savior, Jesus Christ, who has forgiven all your sins.

People: We confess, Lord Jesus, that we have become proud of our religious rituals, personal morality, and good names. We have trusted ourselves instead of Your gift of faith alone. Forgive us and reform us to know again the freedom that relies totally on Your promises.

Pastor: Through Baptism the Holy Spirit has worked faith in your hearts, and through God's Word and Lord's Supper that faith is sustained and strengthened. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen.

NEWS FROM OUR MISSIONARY PRAYER PARTNERS

Dear Friends and Family,

First of all we want to thank those of you who have reached out to us through e-mail, Facebook, etc. to make sure we are okay. Praise God, we are okay – Ankara is about 750 miles away from the area that was affected by the earthquake. We know from people on the ground in the eastern part of the country, however, that the damage and the needs are great.

Zach has been asked to go to Van (a city that suffered much damage) to assist a Turkish Christian congregation with immediate medical and physical needs. He will leave at 4 am tomorrow morning and stay for 2 days. In that time he will also assess how we, as believers, can assist in the days and weeks to come. As is the case with disaster relief, it is difficult to know exactly what to expect upon arrival.

For now, please keep Zach and other relief workers in your prayers. Please pray for the victims of this disaster. So many are sleeping outside without blankets in the cold nights (38 degrees at night, but even lower up in the mountains). The death toll is around 450 people and rising. It has been over 48 hours and the hope of pulling live people out of the rubble is beginning to dwindle.

We have received a few e-mails asking for ways that you can help. As soon as we have more information we will be sharing those ways with you.

Zach will return late Thursday night, then a team from our home congregation, the Lutheran Church of Webster Gardens will be arriving Friday to spend a week here. They will be serving refugees and people with disabilities in the Ankara area. Pray for their travels and the time they will be serving here. Pray that in all things (disaster relief, refugee & care for the disabled) we will point people to Christ. Pray that He is glorified.
