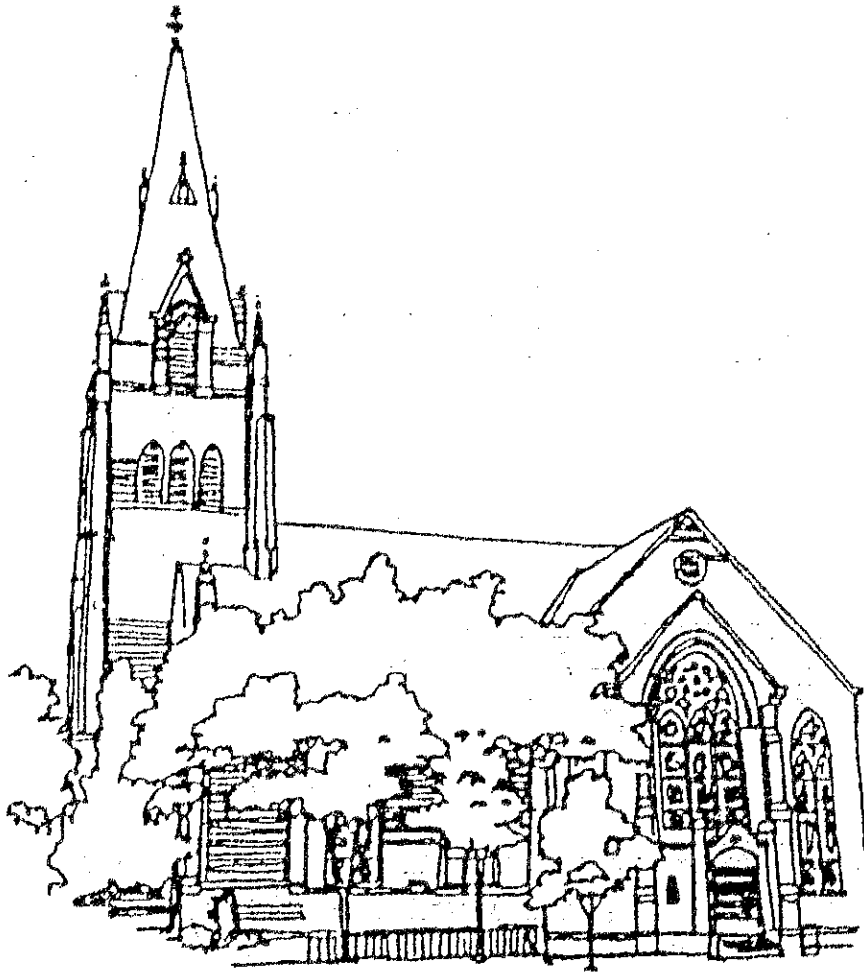

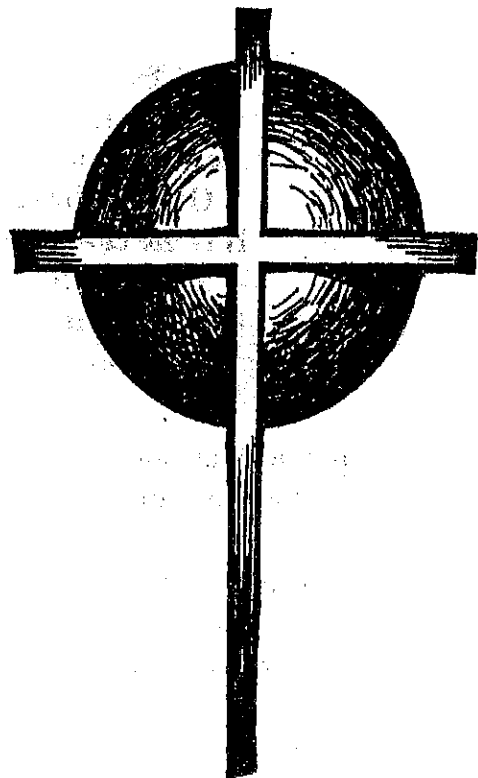

Gospel

Matthew 21:23-27

Leader: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the twenty-first chapter.

People: **Glory to you, O Lord.**

²³ When [Jesus] entered the temple, the chief priests and the elders of the people came up to him as he was teaching, and said, "By what authority are you doing these things, and who gave you this authority?" ²⁴ Jesus answered them, "I also will ask you one question, and if you tell me the answer, then I also will tell you by what authority I do these things. ²⁵ The baptism of John, from where did it come? From heaven or from man?" And they discussed it among themselves, saying, "If we say, 'From heaven,' he will say to us, 'Why then did you not believe him?' ²⁶ But if we say, 'From man,' we are afraid of the crowd, for they all hold that John was a prophet." ²⁷ So they answered Jesus, "We do not know." And he said to them, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I do these things."

Order of Holy Baptism (10:15)

Congregation:

I am Jesus' little lamb,

Pastor: (to the one being baptized)

Our Lord commanded Baptism, saying to his disciples in the last chapter of Matthew: "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in

the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I will be with you always, to the very end of the age.” The holy apostles of the Lord have written: “The promise is for you and your children,” and: “Baptism now saves you.”

We also learn from the Word of God that we all are conceived and born sinful and so are in need of forgiveness. We would be lost forever unless delivered from sin, death, and everlasting condemnation. But the Father of all mercy and grace has sent his Son Jesus Christ, who atoned for the sin of the whole world that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.

Receive the sign of the holy cross both upon your forehead and upon your heart to mark you as one redeemed by Christ the crucified.

Pastor: (to the parents and sponsors)

It is your task as parents and sponsors to confess with the whole Church the faith in our God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, in whose name Grant Ashton Hellert is to be baptized. After he has been baptized you are at all times to remember him in your prayers, put him in mind of his Baptism, and, as much as in you lies, give your counsel and aid, that he share in the true knowledge and worship of God. As he grows in years, you are to place into his hands the Holy Scriptures, bring him to the services of God’s house, and provide for his further instruction in the Christian faith. Our prayer is that, abiding in his baptismal grace and in communion with the Church, he may grow up to lead a godly life to the praise and honor of Jesus Christ. If you intend to do this act of love gladly and willingly, then answer, “Yes, with the help of God.”

Parents and Sponsors: Yes, with the help of God.

Pastor: (to the congregation)

We shall all, together with sponsors and parents, faithfully speak on his behalf in testimony of the forgiveness of sin and the birth of the life of faith which God our Father bestows in and through Baptism.

Pastor: Do you renounce the devil and all his works and all his ways?

People: I do renounce them.

Pastor: Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty?

People: Yes, I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

Pastor: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son?

People: Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From thence he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Pastor: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

People: Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

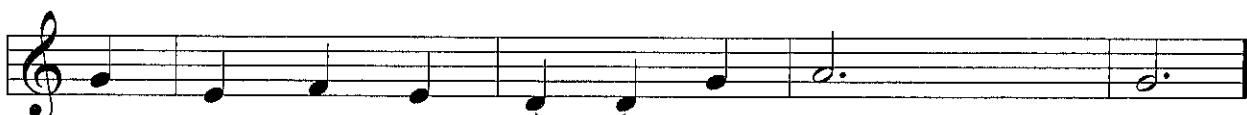

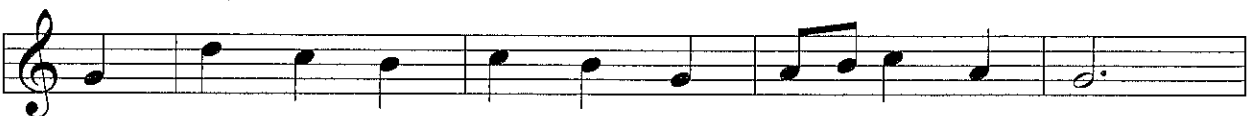

Epistle Lesson

Philippians 2:1-4, 14-18

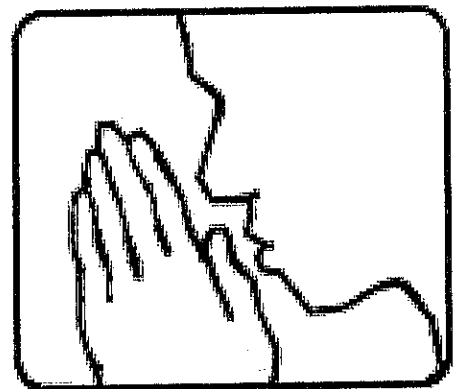

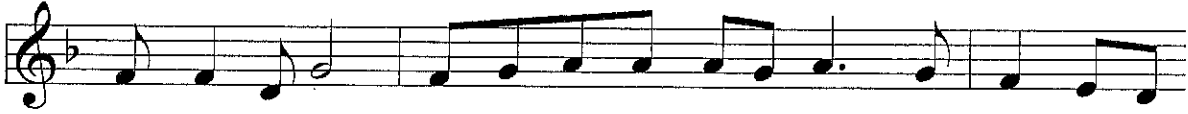

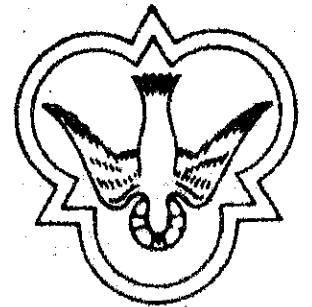

Pastor Walther's Further Accomplishments

Trinity's illustrious, second pastor, C.F.W. Walther, achieved several major accomplishments while he was our pastor, beside creating a hymnal.

On the national scene, he introduced the idea of a synodical body to unify the efforts of doctrinally like-minded Lutheran churches throughout the midwest, including the training of pastors and teachers. After receiving approval from Trinity's voters and meeting with other Lutheran leaders, in 1847 he went to Chicago to meet with the pastors of thirteen other parishes. They voted to form what was then called "The Evangelical Lutheran Synod of Missouri, Ohio and other States," today's 2.5 million-member Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod.

In St. Louis, Trinity grew under his leadership. Trinity members living on the north side of the city formed a parish called Immanuel. It was to be a branch of Trinity,



because the people did not want to give up Walther as their pastor. After Trinity opened a branch school where Holy Cross now stands, it eventually became another congregation. As no one there wanted to give up Pastor Walther either, Holy Cross became the third parish of what became known as the *Gesammtgemeinde* or "Combined Congregation." Later, Zion congregation in north St. Louis was also added to the *Gesammtgemeinde* -- one large congregation with four church buildings. This arrangement continued until Pastor Walther's death in 1887, at which time the four parishes separated into individual congregations.

Amazingly, Pastor Walther was required to preach at all four churches. Visitors to the museum at the LCMS International Center in Kirkwood will see the last of three horse-drawn carriages purchased by Trinity congregation to transport Pastor Walther to the churches for morning, afternoon and evening services.

This being the Bicentennial year of Walther's birth, there are many special projects, events, tours and services being planned in commemoration. Trinity will be hosting a special service at 3 p.m. Sunday, October 23, 2011.

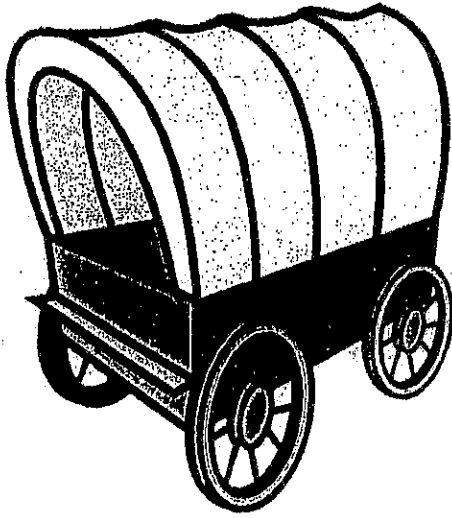
